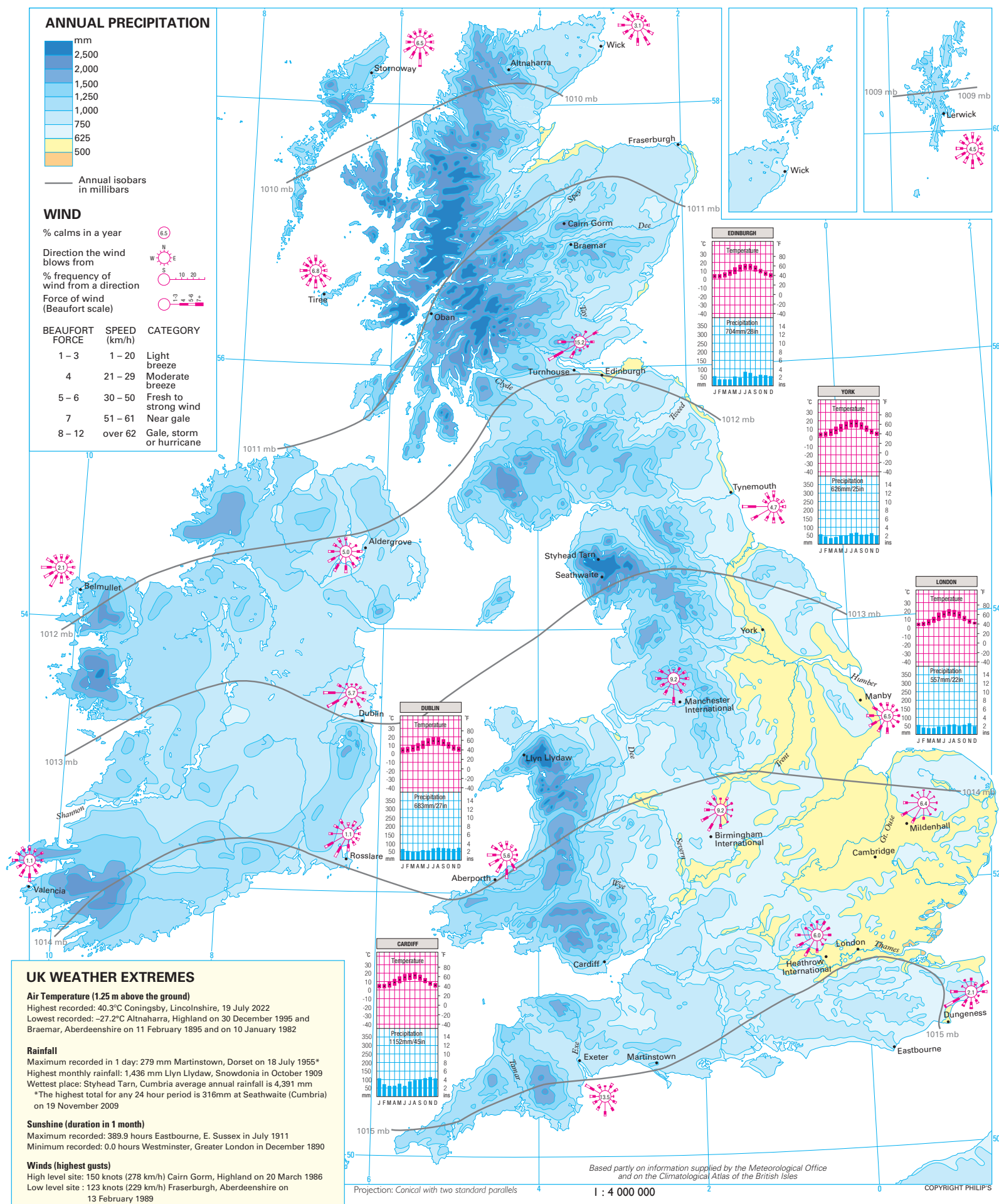
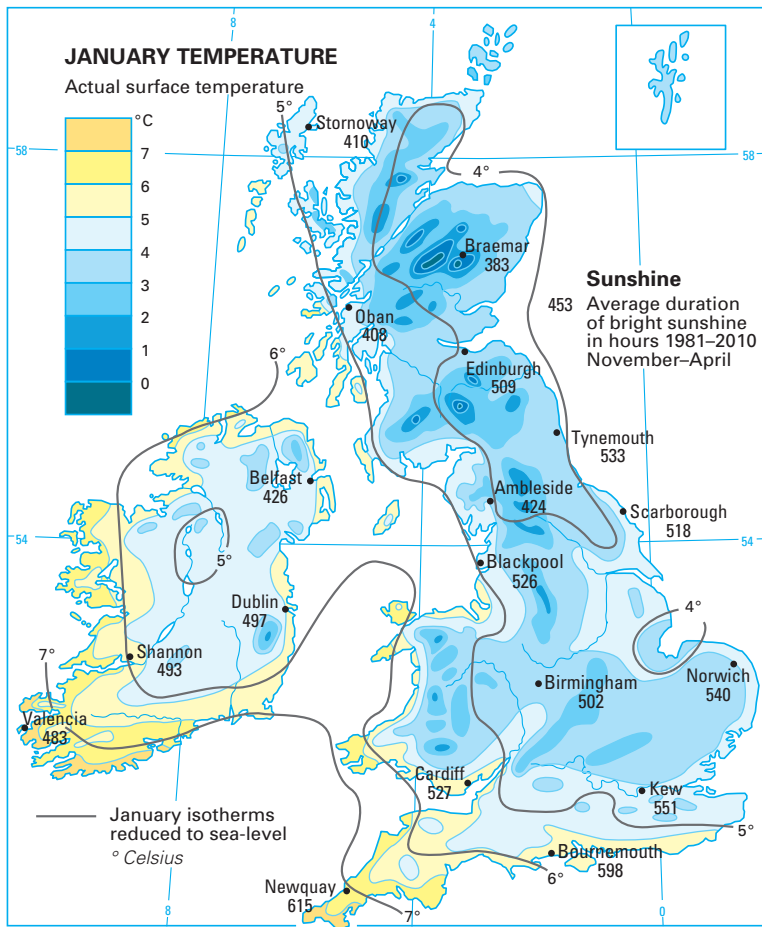
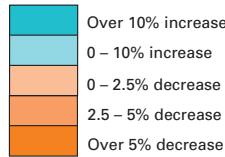




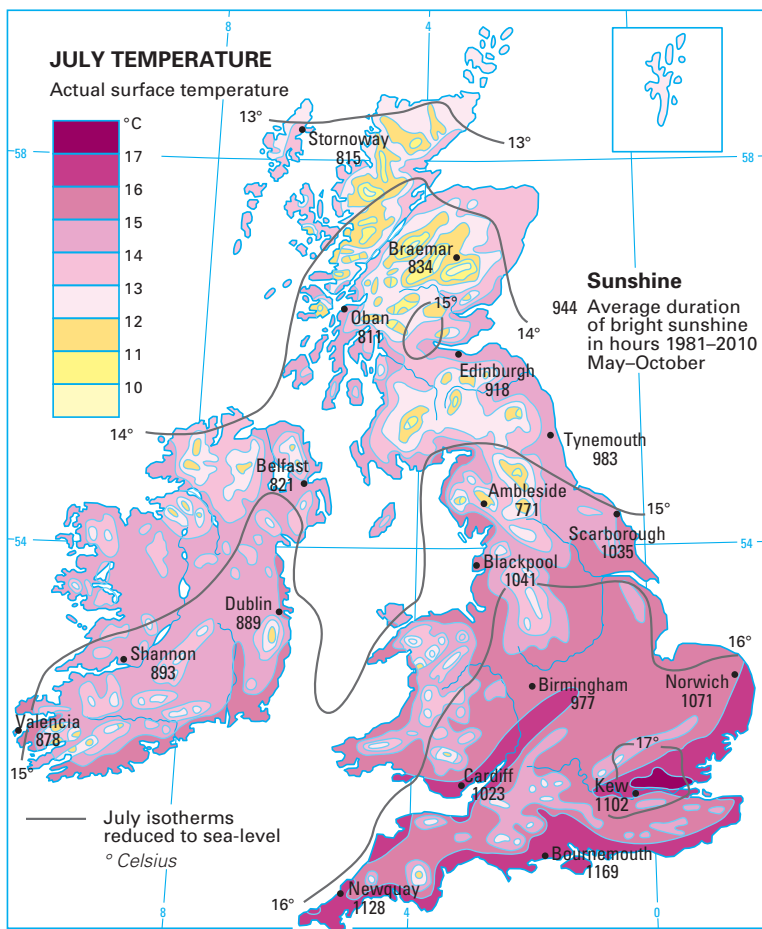
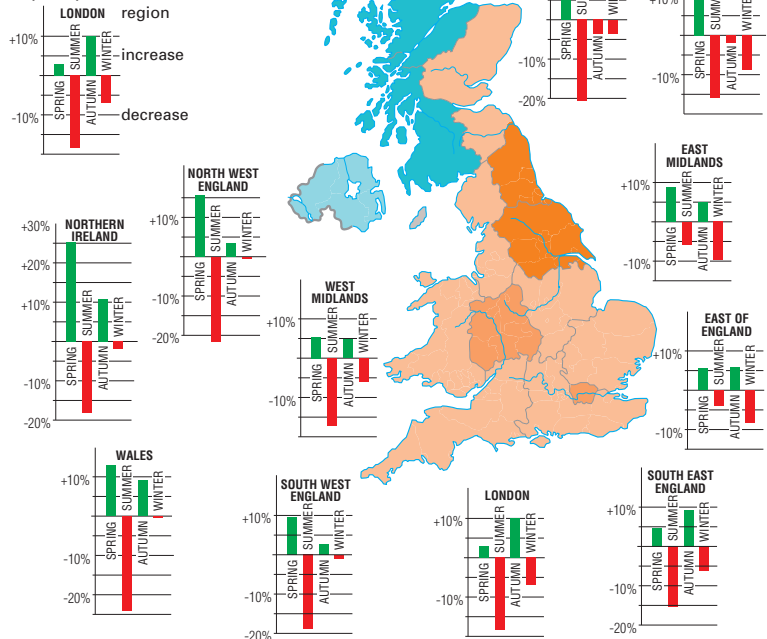


CHANGES IN UK RAINFALL PATTERNS

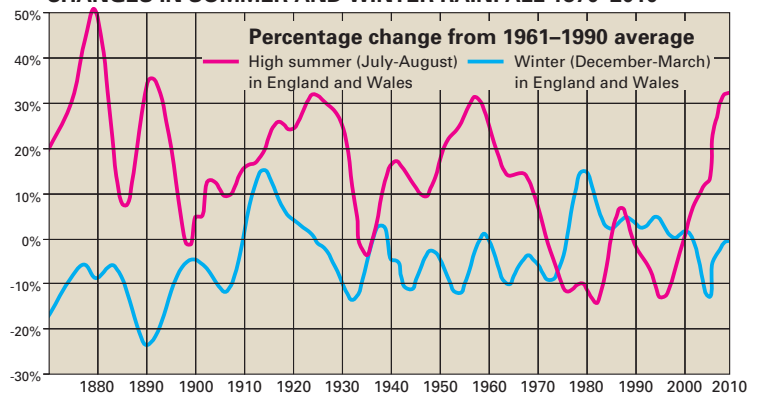
Annual percentage change in precipitation, 1914–2007



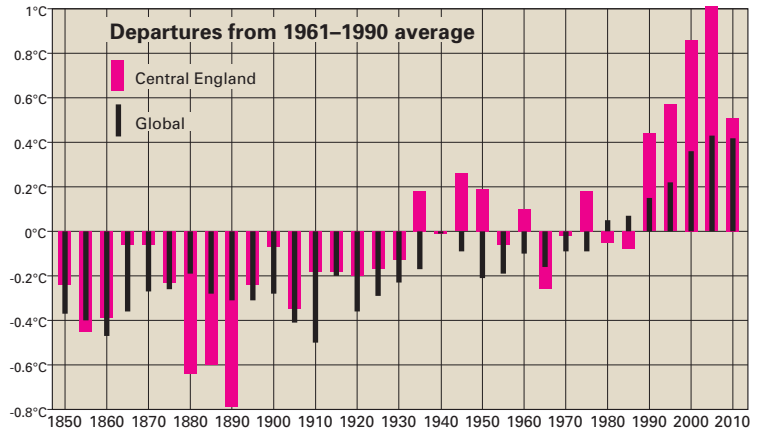
Seasonal percentage change in precipitation, 1914–2007



CHANGES IN SUMMER AND WINTER RAINFALL 1870–2010



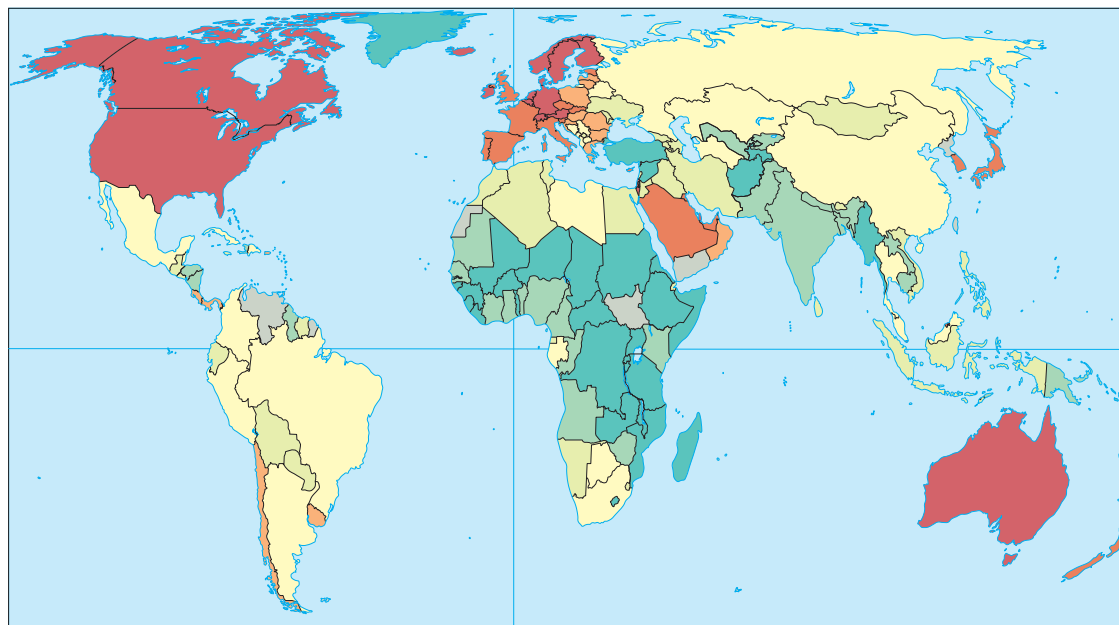
CHANGES IN AVERAGE SURFACE TEMPERATURE 1850–2010

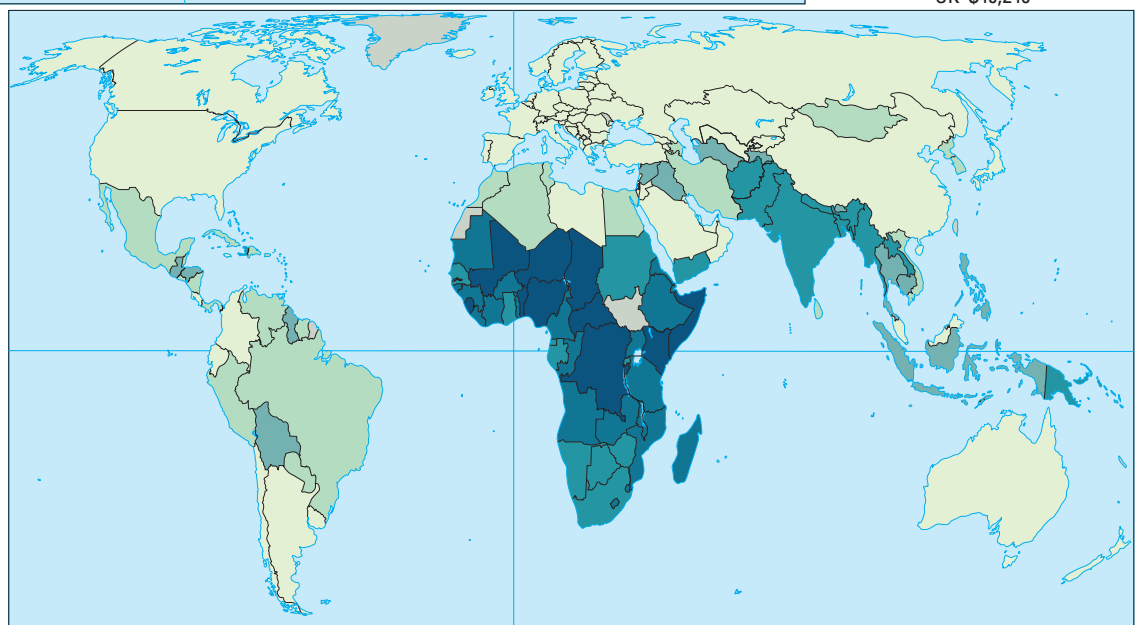
Mortality rate attributed to unsafe water, unsafe sanitation and lack of hygiene per 100,000 population

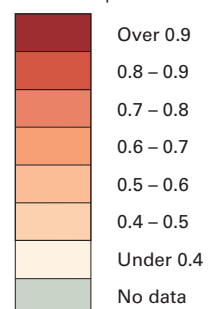

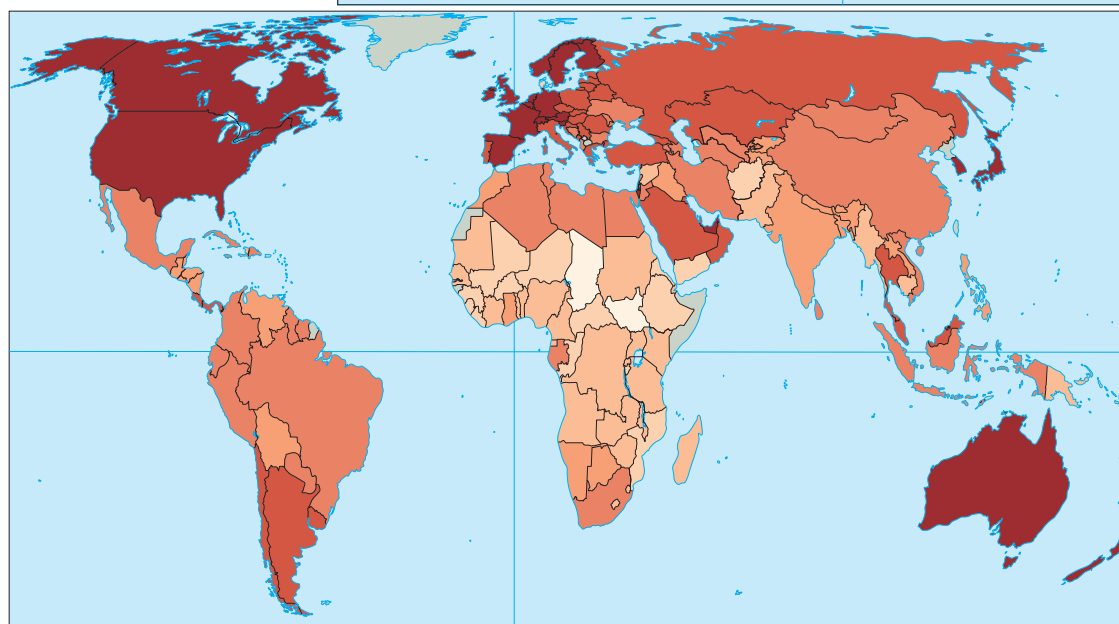
HUMAN DEVELOPMENT INDEX

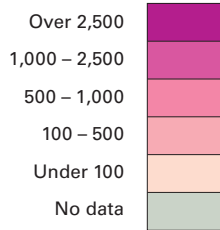
